

ASHRAE Technology Award is for recognizing the ASHRAE members who design or conceive an innovative technological concept which incorporate ASHRAE standards for effective energy management, indoor air quality (IAQ) as well as good mechanical design and highlight technological achievement of ASHRAE to others, including associated professional and societies worldwide, as well as building and facility owners. ASHRAE SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE TECHNICAL SEMINAR-"PRACTICAL USE OF OPERATING DATE -**EXPERIENCE OF SWIRE PROPERTIES**" by Mr Alvin Lo

Building Sustainability technical seminar with the topic of "Practical Use of Operating Data - Experience of Swire Properties" by Ir Cary Chan was successfully held on 17 April 2014 at Hong Kong Polytechnic University. This seminar had attracted over 60 registrations and about 50 people were participated.

About the Speaker

Ir Cary WH Chan is currently responsible for overseeing the sustainability policies and strategies for Swire Properties. Over the years, he has carried out a lot of researches and energy saving initiatives with substantial improvements in energy performance of buildings.

Presentation

This presentation illustrated the engineering of an intelligent energy management solution that will considerably reduce energy consumption, both by systematically avoiding energy wasting in buildings and by knowledge-based holistic optimization of energy consumption. The intelligent energy management solution was based on existing knowledge representation technologies like functional modeling, which was used in the context of smart buildings in combination with Building Automation Systems.

This presentation demonstrated how this knowledge based energy management system works in Swire Properties and shared the experience with the attendance.

ASHRAE Hong Kong Chapter had organized a technical workshop titled "Water Side Commissioning" on 24th June 2014 (Tuesday) in Jupiter Conference Room, Wanchai Conference Centre, 17/F, East Town Building, 41 Lockhart Road, Wanchai. The seminar is jointly organised with BEAM Society Limited.

The workshop started at 6:30pm in that evening. 135 participants attended the technical workshop. In the beginning, Mr. Cecil Man, Chapter Technology Transfer Committee Chair (2013-14), delivered a welcoming address to all participants and introduced the background of the speakers. All of them have extensive design and commissioning experiences in Chiller systems and water balancing in buildings.

The workshop was divided into 2 sessions. During the first session, Mauro Montello, Jack Porrini & Fabio Zambon shared the design and commissioning experiences in the Singapore Sports Hub. During the second session, Tom Pak provided insight on a new approach of water balancing and a technique that can help to save energy for chilled water system at the on/off valve type FCU. The presentation was followed by a Q&A session.

The workshop finally ended at 9:30pm. Mr. Thomas Chan, President-Elect (2013-14), represented ASHRAE Hong Kong Chapter to present Certificates of Appreciation and expressed gratitude to all the 4 speakers conducting such valuable workshop.





GRASSROOTS GOVERNMENT AFFAIR by Dr. Raymond Yau



GGAC Macau Visit

On 22 August 2013, Grassroots Government Affair Committee (GGAC) and Macau Section visited the Instituto Para Os Assuntos Civicos e Municipais (IACM) of the Macau SAR Government. During the visit, the representatives discussed the latest development of HVAC system and shared the design experience gained from their work. It was found that ASHRAE Publication such as handbooks, standards and guidelines were of great help to support the professional engineers to serve as good references and to solve the technical problems in Macau.

The GGAC representatives thus introduced various updated publications including the Standard 189.1, Standard for the Design of High-Performance Green Buildings and Standard 90.1, Energy Standard for Buildings Except Low-Rise Residential Buildings. It was also discussed the application of Standard 55, Thermal Environmental Conditions for Human Occupancy, Standard 62.1, Ventilation for Acceptable Indoor Air and Standard 90.1 in green building certifications such as Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) system.

Last but not least, the GGAC also promoted the ASHRAE membership and its benefit to the IACM representatives. The GGAC would continue to look for ways to strengthen the linkages with IACM in the future.

Meeting with Architectural Services Department of Hong Kong SAR

The GGAC is committed to strengthening collaborations and establishing linkages with government bodies to support its professionals in the pursuit of excellence in the field of HVAC engineering. This is exemplified by the communication meeting with the Architectural Services Department of the Hong Kong SAR Government conducted on 3 September 2013.

At the beginning of the meeting, ArchSD introduced their knowledge management practices. Numerous topics of mutual interests such as recent development in green government buildings, sharing of BS works experience and practices and research, technical events and forums were also discussed, followed by an introduction of ASHRAE by Chapter President to update ArchSD the officers and board of ASHRAE Hong Kong Chapter for the year term 2013-2014 and the latest development of the ASHRAE standard and research project. It is expected that the meeting could deepen the ties between ASHRAE and the ArchSD.
