Programme Highlights

2008 Olympic Games was one of the biggest events in the year 2008. With the famous horse racing history and resources, Hong Kong was selected as the co-host city for the Equestrian Events. It was the first Olympic event in Hong Kong history. The events enhance Hong Kong sport development and a good preparation for the upcoming 2009 East Asians Games.

The Olympic Games will be broadcast live across the World, and therefore the lighting system has been designed in according with the stringent HDTV Olympic Standards. A minimum level of vertical illuminance for all parts of the arena was set by the Beijing Olympic Broadcasting (BOB) at 1400 lux with high colour rendering, low levels of glare and spill light. This was to ensure the highest quality of pictures could be produced for over 4 billion people around the globe who watched the Games via television and the internet.

The Shatin venue can be divided into several sections namely, main arena, warm-up arena, media mixed zone, training arenas and horse stables.

The talk will share the experiences on lighting system, from concept, design, installation to testing and commissioning.
