Programme Highlight:

T2 is a multi-modal hub where sea, land and air transport converge seamlessly. Easily accessible via the Airport Express train, buses, taxis and private cars, T2 houses a 36-bay coach station serving hotel shuttles, and local and Mainland tour buses. T2 is designed and built to meet future demand and includes 56 airline check-in counters; customs, immigration and security screening facilities; a 4D cinema; retail, entertainment, and restaurant facilities. E&M installations include an Automated People Mover connection between Terminal 1 and Terminal 2, baggage handling system. 5,000 tons chilled water plant, over 80 Air Handling Units, 21 elevators etc, that provide a comfortable and efficient Terminal for passengers
