**Programme Highlight:**

The Fire Services Training School, occupying 3.24 hectares of rural land at Pat Heung in NT, is primarily responsible for initial training of new recruits. It also runs basic fire fighting courses for staff of government departments and private organizations. The visit will cover the training facilities which comprise simulators for compartment fire behaviour training, fire rigs, a breathing apparatus and tactical training block, the sprinkler system testing laboratories and a large scale Heat Release Rate Test Room to ISO 9705.
